Principal's Message - Jane Todd, Principal

Dear Parents,

Now that spring is officially upon us, the dust has settled a bit from the levy last February, and before the summer starts and the dust rises again because of construction, I thought you may have questions concerning the addition to Redmond High School I may be able to answer here. I am including a number of pieces of information to this letter I hope you will find useful. I invite you to contact me or the project manager, whose information is provided in the FAQ sheet, if you find you still have questions left unanswered.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you personally for your support of the levy a few months ago. I know these are very tough times and it is a tribute to the strength of this community and the importance you place on quality education that you did so.

I would also like to acknowledge and voice my appreciation for the responsiveness of the district on this project. Our staff raised concerns about the number of classrooms originally planned for the new wing (10) and whether they would accommodate the projected number of students. The district responded by adding another four classrooms to the plans. Our staff raised concerns about the need for an auxiliary gym, and the district was able to show us the data used and to convince us the need was real. Our staff raised concerns about accessibility to the loading dock of the Performing Arts Center, and the district worked to reconfigure the plans to make certain the show(s) could go on. And our staff raised concerns about the portables shown in the plans. The district helped us understand that portables are planned **in case** they are needed in the future, not as a given, and **if** they are needed, we are assured they will be made to look as much as possible like the existing building. We are further assured that construction will be confined to areas which will not impact student safety, access or instruction while school is in session.

Please do let me know if you have other questions or concerns. And I'll take this opportunity to thank you for allowing me to work with your children this year and to wish you all a wonderful, relaxing, energizing summer. See you in September!

College Practice Tests sponsored by the RHS PTSA are tentatively scheduled for the 2011-2012 school year as follows:

Fall Mock SAT	Sat, Sep 17th
Fall Practice ACT	Sat, Nov 12th
Winter Mock SAT	Sat, Feb 25th
Winter Practice ACT	Wed, Mar 14th

These full-length practice tests are administered by the Princeton Review and offer students the opportunity to practice test taking strategies and determine baseline scores prior to taking the official SAT and ACT college entrance exams. Tests results are provided back to the students in the form of a detailed Score Report that identifies individual strengths and areas for improvement. CELEBRATIONS AND GOOD-BYES

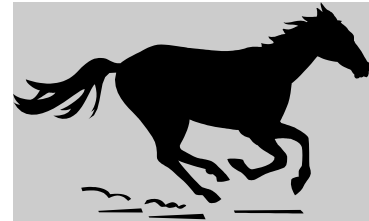

Q. Where will the new additions be located?

A. Two separate building additions are included in the project. A new two-story addition located south of the existing Performing Arts Center that will house Classrooms, Science Labs, an Art Room, and support functions. There will be a total of fourteen new classrooms in the addition. Also a one-story addition located south of the existing Weight Room will house a new Auxiliary Gym.

Q. Why is an auxiliary gym being added?

A. The district approved Educational Specification shows that the adding ninth graders to the student population creates the need for additional P.E. space.

Q. Why are portables being planned?

A. With every major project, the district master-plans portables on the site. At this time, it is not known whether or not portables will be needed when the building opens in Fall 2012, or if they may be needed in the future.

Q. Where are you in the project's process?

A. Construction Documents are being completed; the City of Redmond is reviewing the project for applicable permit approvals.

Q. When will the construction begin and the building(s) open?

A. Construction will begin during the summer of 2011 and the addition project will be open in the fall of 2012.

Q. What will the outside of the school look like?

A. The exterior design has been approved by the City of Redmond's Design Review Board. The building additions have been carefully planned to match the existing character of the current school. Q. How can the district afford school construction given the current state of economy?

A. This specific project was funded by a voter-approved levy measure in February 2011. The district greatly appreciates the community's willingness to support these projects during such a difficult economic time.

Q. How is the student population at Redmond High changing?

A. Beginning in fall 2012, ninth graders will be added to all high schools in the district. That move was made for educational reasons but will also help relieve pressure in our overcrowded elementary schools, since 6th graders will shift into the middle schools, replacing the ninth graders who move to high school. (See www.lwsd.org/News/Shifting-Grades for more information.). So, in 2012, Redmond High School will serve grades nine through twelve. In addition, there are developments in Redmond that are adding housing and therefore school-age children.

Q. How does district determine how many students to design the Addition projects for?

A. Normally, the District's educational facility standards define how many students each type of school (elementary, junior, or high school) should be designed to serve. The District's goal is to create equitable school facilities throughout the district. In this case, the shift of ninth grade students into the high schools was a significant driver in the total number of students. However, simply adding enough space for the anticipated numbers of ninth grade students would have created a larger high school than our community is comfortable with. As a result, an additional secondary school on the east side, that will be open to students from around the district, is anticipated to draw some of the students from Redmond.

Q. Will there be construction traffic and parking around the school?

A. Construction traffic will be present with the additions project. The existing southeast entrance to the school will be the designated construction entrance. Construction parking will be within the limits of the construction fence and not affect existing parking.

Q. Will outside groups still be able to use the building and field facilities during construction?

A. The district suspends all non-school use of the building, fields and grounds for the duration of construction because construction already places some demands on school scheduling because of contractor's activities. Schools need the flexibility during construction to be able to use all of their spaces as needed when construction impacts various parts of the building. Outdoor uses may also be impacted by safety issues.

Grades and the end of the School Year

As the days get warmer, many of our students find their thoughts turning to summer activities. Seniors especially often have a difficult time keeping themselves on track. Please remind your student that the school year is not quite over yet and they still have plenty of work to do! Parents are reminded to keep checking Standard Score as a wonderful tool to help keep their students on track. If you feel there is a discrepancy, you are also welcome to email teachers for specific questions or concerns. **Remember, seniors must have all graduation requirements completed (including all level 5 essays, Formal Lab Report, QSR and their portfolio presentation) or they will not be allowed to walk at the graduation ceremony!** Also, colleges require a final high school transcript sent to check second semester grades and they do reserve the right to rescind acceptances if students show lack of progress. For sophomores and juniors, they do have the option of taking missing credits through summer school (see below).

Summer School

Registration information for Lake Washington School District Summer School is now available on line! Registration dates are May 16-June 24. This is an excellent chance for your student to earn missing credits or increase skills for next year. Please refer to the district website or counseling office for more information. And do remember that your student's counselor must sign the form before registration for summer school can be finalized. Also, the summer school registration forms are available on line or from your counselor in Spanish!

PSAT – Save The Date!

We will be giving the PSAT on Wednesday, October 12, 2011. The price will be \$15.00. This will be the only date the test will be offered at Redmond High School. Registration information will be available during back to school activities in August.

College Search and Honors Services

Many of our students receive offers for college searches or honors programs that they can participate in for a fee. While some of these services are legitimate, many are scams offering services that your student can get for a better rate elsewhere or for free. Students should not have to pay for honors recognition or scholarship services. There are many free search engines on the internet, and Mrs. Davidson in our career center has an extensive list of scholarships! If you are looking for college planning services, your school counselor can be a great asset, and there are also very good local private counseling services that will give a more personalized service than most available through the mail. Before you pay any money to a consultant service, do check their affiliations and qualifications.

And if you have any questions please feel free to ask your counselor. Remember, buyer beware!

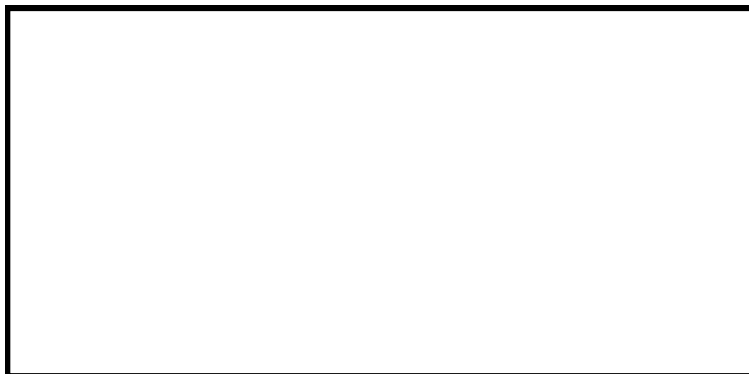
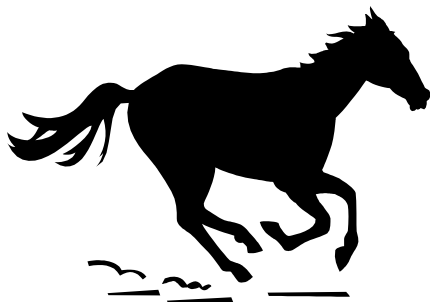
